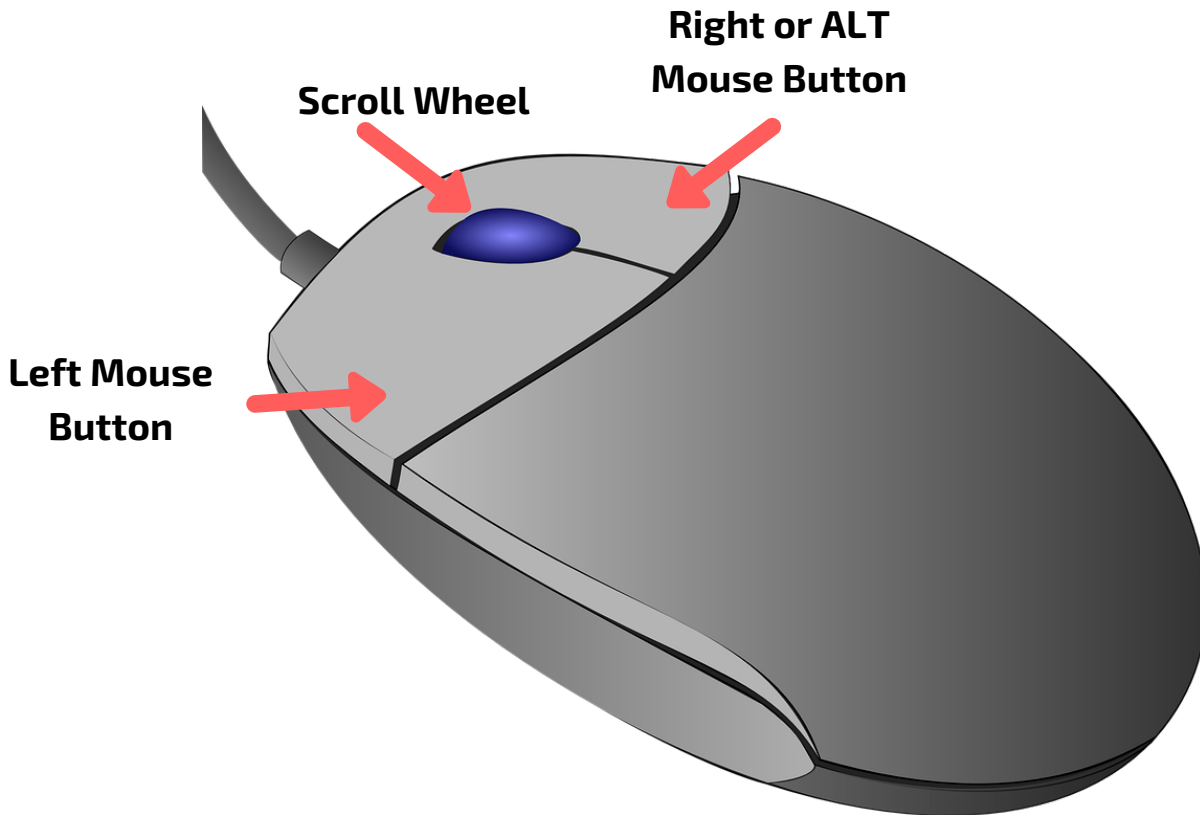

Left Mouse Button

Click once to select an item.
Click twice (double-click) to execute an action.

Right or ALT Mouse Button

Click once to see more options.
Double-clicking does nothing.

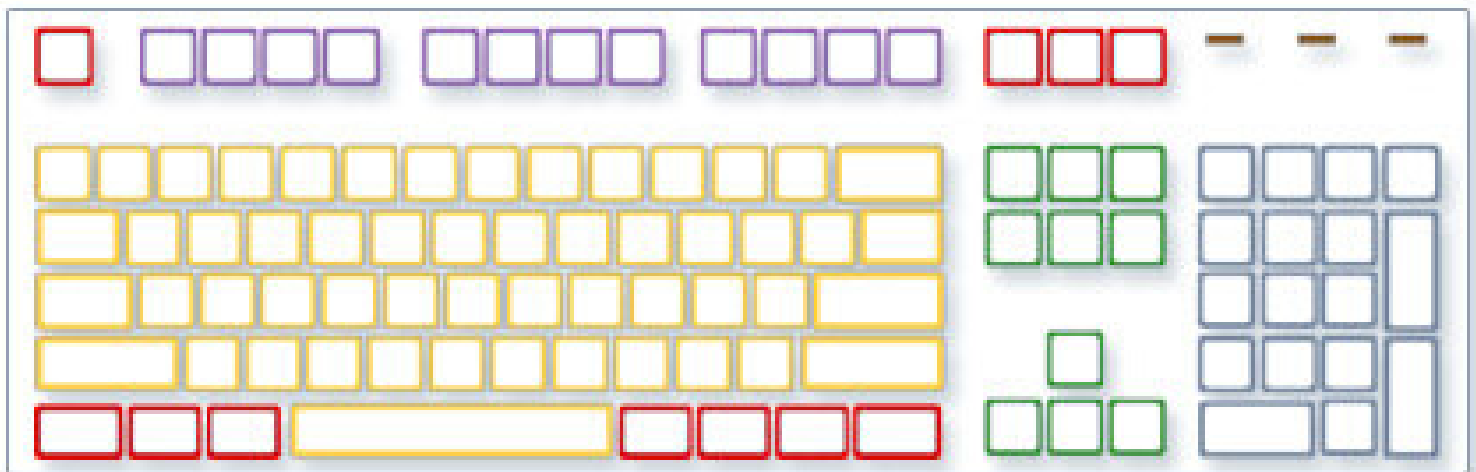
This site offers a number of mouse games that will help people practice. These are more active, faster pace games.
